About

Andrew Garton

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Andrew is a freelance filmmaker, creative producer, musician and communications media advisor with over thirty years experience working within community-based cross-cultural development contexts. With an emphasis on collaboration, Andrew thrives within multidisciplinary production environments bringing a broad range of skills to projects that have seen him work across Australia, Southeast Asia, Indo-China, South Asia and Central Europe.

Andrew was a co-creator of Pegasus Networks, the earliest community focused national internet provider in Australia. Pegasus went online in 1989. In 1995 he co-founded of the artist-led production house, Toy Satellite producing cutting edge online interactives for museums and creative research initiatives in Austria, South Korea and Taiwan. In 2001 Andrew produced the opening of the Taipei International Arts Festival in collaboration with Taiwanese artists, touring the completed work, Undercurrents, throughout Australia. Undercurrents focused on the shared social, environmental and cultural concerns of both groups of artists. A series of commissions followed including works for the Australian Centre for the Moving Image, Fringe Fashion, Melbourne International Film Festival, MAAP, Ars Electronica, KunstRadio, the Australian Broadcasting Corporation and a two-year artists residency at the Dunmoochin Foundation regional Victoria. Many of these works focused on empathy building through diverse screen culture practices.

Andrew has produced numerous public events collaborating with artists on such wide-ranging topics as creative commons licensing for screen producers (Arts Law Week), collaborative book and place-making for authors, mixed media arts production with asylum seekers exploring connections to their homelands (Bamiyarra), the history of psychedelic lighting design in Melbourne (The Light Show) and more recently crafting performance installations on the cosmology of the last forest dwellers of Sarawak (Tong Tana) and podcasting. In fact, Andrew produced one of the earliest podcasts in Australia. His 2018 series, Right to Know, was commissioned by the Association for Progressive Communications.

In 2012 Andrew returned to filmmaking, writing and directing and set-up Secession Films in regional Victoria. In 2015 he began work on his first feature film, Ocean in a Drop - broadband impacts rural India, with the New Delhi based Digital Empowerment Foundation. Ocean in a Drop was launched at the Chennai International Film Festival in 2017 with the support of the Australian High Commission, India. His first book, Right to Know - India's Internet Avant-Garde, was published by the Digital Empowerment Foundation and the Australia India Institute.

Andrew's next feature, <u>Forged from Fire - the making of the Blacksmiths'</u>
<u>Tree</u> will be launched in February 2019 to coincide with Black Saturday memorial events.

He created new initiatives that merged new media within Open Channel's training portfolio, re-established hands-on production training with Melbourne's Channel 31 and produced the re-launch of the organisation in 2007. Andrew had also expanded the scope of their Framed public lecture series.
